



**FOR HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE** - The Jewish Motorcyclists Alliance (JMA) will hold its first-ever "Ride to Remember", bringing a Torah scroll dating to 1929 Czechoslovakia which was used during the Holocaust, to Washington, D.C., on May 6.

"The ride is bringing people together; Jewish motorcyclists together," said Rabbi Zach Betesh (above, right), an associate rabbi with Chabad Lubavitch of Fort Lauderdale who serves as the spiritual leader of the King David Bikers motorcycle club, part of the JMA. "This will let people know that we will never forget."

The Torah, secured in a special carrying case, will be attached to Rabbi Betesh's Harley-Davidson. The rabbi will ride his 2002 Ultra Classic Harley - named "Harley Ben-David" - which is outfitted with a *mezuzah*.

Several hundred Jewish motorcycle enthusiasts from the East Coast up to Toronto are expected to participate in the ride, which ends at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington.
